The Petey Greene Program at a Glance

Founded in 2008, the Petey Greene Program (PGP) supports the academic goals of incarcerated and formerly incarcerated people through high-quality volunteer tutoring programs, while educating volunteers on the injustice manifest in our carceral system and encouraging them to engage in justice-oriented activism to reimagine the criminal legal system.



Since its founding, the PGP has tutored roughly 16,000 students in over **50 correctional facilities and reentry programs.**



We've recruited more than 3,200 volunteer tutors from **30 universities in seven states and the District of Columbia.**

How We Can Support You!

The PGP has fifteen years of experience providing academic support services for incarcerated and formerly incarcerated learners. Building on this experience, the PGP can help other organizations, companies, and universities develop systems, learning opportunities, and tools to advance educational justice inside and outside carceral spaces. We have an extensive network of partners including local community organizations and correctional institutions to help create workshops, lectures, training resources, and more.

Specific Options and Models

Access to the PGP Trainings and Library of Curated Resources

Individuals and organizations can pay a fee to attend the Petey Greene Program's trainings and view our library of curated resources:

- **One-time access to the PGP live introductory training: \$300**
- **One-year access to all PGP live and recorded trainings: \$500**

The PGP trainings include:

- **5-hour online (live or recorded) introductory training with related pre-readings and tutoring resources covering: The Carceral State, Educational Justice, Education in Carceral and Reentry Spaces, Ethical Volunteerism, Tutoring Strategies, and more.**
- **Subject-specific trainings on issues such as: Disability Justice Informed Tutoring, Student Motivation and Engagement, Tutoring Math and Test-Taking Skills, and more. One-year participants will have access to 2-3 live trainings per semester and to the PGP archive of recorded trainings.**

College Bridge and Community Engagement Training and Curriculum Development

The PGP has developed a College Bridge program that helps incarcerated and formerly incarcerated students develop the writing, reading, and numeracy skills that are necessary to pursue employment and post-secondary education, while fostering a sense of self-efficacy and self-confidence that will support in these pursuits. We have previously established partnerships with institutions of higher education to offer a co-curricular course that enables students to serve as tutors for the PGP College Bridge Program and receive training from their university's faculty and PGP staff.

- **\$3,000 per course**
- **Includes access to all PGP trainings and resources**
- **Ad-hoc trainings for instructors and students**
- **Support with curriculum development, student recruitment and selection**
- **Coordination with correctional facilities (including clearance, scheduling, etc)**
